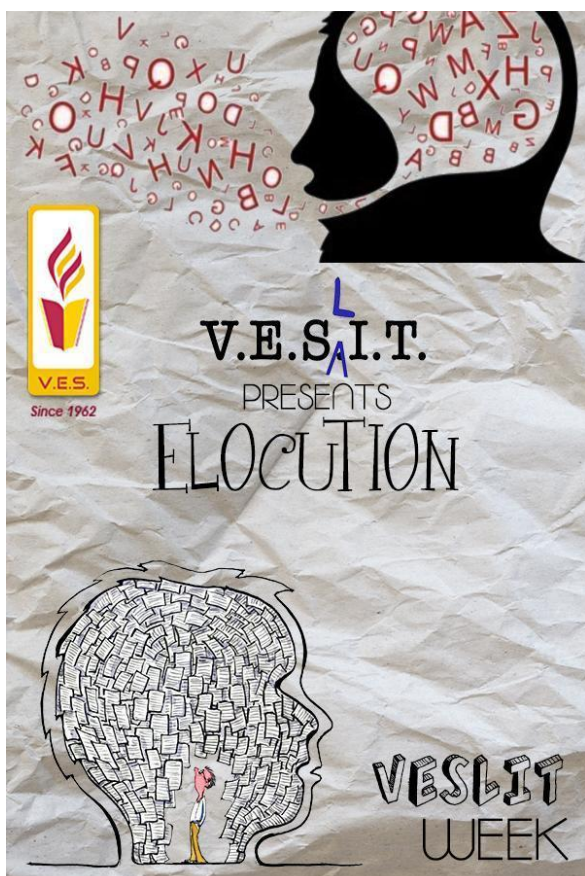
4. Elocution
